



PROJECT ACCESS SAN DIEGO

Project Access San Diego is modeled after a successful, nationwide program being implemented in 50 cities around the country.

The heart of the program is to assist patients who cannot afford medical services and do not have insurance or qualify for public health insurance programs.

Project Access' network of volunteer physicians and hospitals provide the full range of healthcare at no charge to low-income and uninsured residents of San Diego County.

Project Access provides the following services to patients.

- Donated office visits to physicians and other medical providers
- Donated inpatient and outpatient hospital care
- Donated laboratory services
- Donated imaging services
- Donated surgical care
- Interpretation for patients who are in need
- Transportation to and from scheduled appointments
- Durable Medical Equipment and Pharmaceuticals (subject to \$1,000 annual limit)

Project Access patients meet the following criteria.

- Resident of San Diego County
- Have an annual income of under 300% of the federal poverty level
- Do not have health insurance or access to public health insurance programs
